Our Equipment

At Crab Apple we pride ourselves on our fine fleet of rafts, inflatable kayaks and personal outfitting gear. We know that outstanding service means ensuring your safety and comfort during your trip.

We own nearly 150 self-bailing Hyside rafts and inflatable kayaks. These include five different boat sizes designed to give you the safest, most exciting ride on the river trip you choose.

Our personal outfitting gear will make you feel comfortable. Over 400 wetsuits and lifejackets are sized for all rafters and continuously updated to ensure your safety.

Finally, we make the extra effort to ensure your safety by carrying advanced first aid and rescue gear in the rafts. We are among a small percentage of outfitters nationwide to carry satellite and cell phones on our river trips.

Our Facilities

Crab Apple offers what no one else can in New England rafting - top notch base camps overlooking the Kennebec River in Maine and the Deerfield River in Massachusetts.

In Maine, our facility is built for multi-day stays.

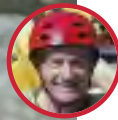

rapids such as "Three Sisters", "Whitewash" and "Magic Falls" await you at every turn. The second part of the river has some long intermediate rapids like "Dead Stream Falls", "Black Brook" and opens up for better views of the primitive wilderness and opportunities for "bodysurfing" in smaller rapids. The trip ends where it began, right back at our base - no long shuttle ride! Join us for world class whitewater on our "home river", the mighty Kennebec!

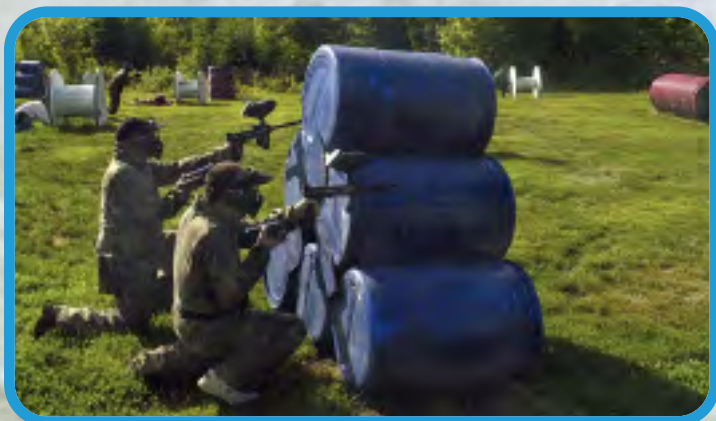
Rapid Shot Paintball

We opened our paintball fields in Maine in 2006 to give our guests another activity to enjoy during their stay. Some played after rafting and many stayed for an extra day of paintball action. We were surprised at the range of people that had so much fun – first-timers, veteran players, men, women, families, schools, summer camps, bachelor parties, etc.

We have four great fields – our “Mayday” field is built around a small aircraft that we purchased from a crash site and re-located to our field – take the aircraft from the opposing team and you win! Our “Patriot” field is a red, white and blue speedball field. The colorful bunkers keep you hidden and moving toward the enemy flag. The “Bunker Hill” field must be stormed from the front where a small hill and fire base protect it from oncoming assault.

Finally, our “Maine Street” field is an urban assault scenario with fourteen complete buildings mocking a small town.

All four fields are awesome! Come to Crab Apple and “shoot the rapids” and then follow up by shooting some paintballs on our custom fields at Rapid Shot Paintball.

Our base includes a restaurant and pub which serve breakfast before raft trips and refreshments and great food after a day on the river. Our **Snow Cottage** was designed with flexibility and convenience in mind for rafters. It is complete with kitchenette, full bath, cable TV, bedroom and living room.

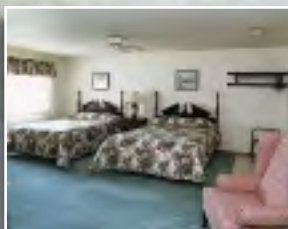

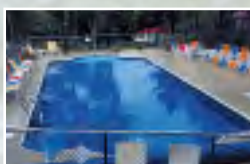

Physical Limitations: Pregnant women, persons with a heart condition and anyone with a medical problem that could be affected by the heat, cold, exertion, excitement, etc. of a raft trip may not raft. We reserve the right to refuse anyone the opportunity to participate in any of our adventures because of a medical, physical or size limitation that we feel might expose them to extreme risk. Contact our office with questions concerning these policies.

Drugs and Alcohol: No drugs or alcohol are permitted before or during a trip. Violators of this policy may not raft, and no refund will be given. All of our facilities hold liquor licenses and due to state laws no other alcohol will be permitted on Crab Apple property.

Reservations: State regulations limit the number of passengers we can carry, so reserve early to ensure a spot on your desired trip date. However, if you are looking for a last minute trip, we can often accommodate you.

Payment Policy: Reservations made more than 60 days in advance of your trip date require the following deposit within 7 days of your phone reservation:

In Maine \$50 per person per river trip

In Massachusetts \$40 per person per river trip

The balance of your trip is due 60 days in advance.

Reservations made within 60 days of the trip date require payment in full.

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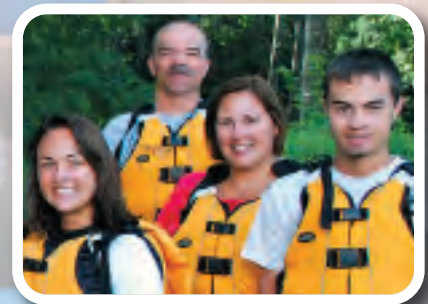
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
